CRAFT SAFETY: Adult supervision is required for any arts & crafts project. Avoid use of small parts with children ages 3 or younger. Read all manufacturers' warnings before using arts & crafts supplies.

RAINBOW ROCKING SNAIL CRAFT

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Safety scissors
- Non-toxic glue
- Googly eyes
- Non-toxic markers
- Construction paper
- Ruler

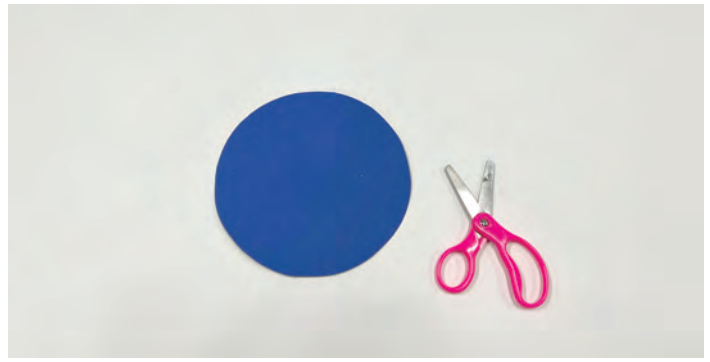

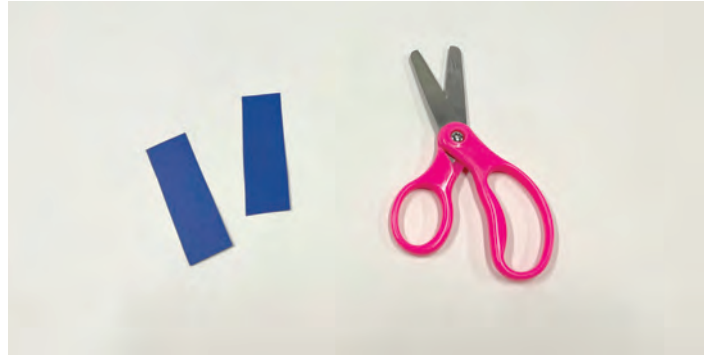
1. Pick out construction paper colors.



2. Cut out an 8 x 8 inch circle out of the blue construction paper.



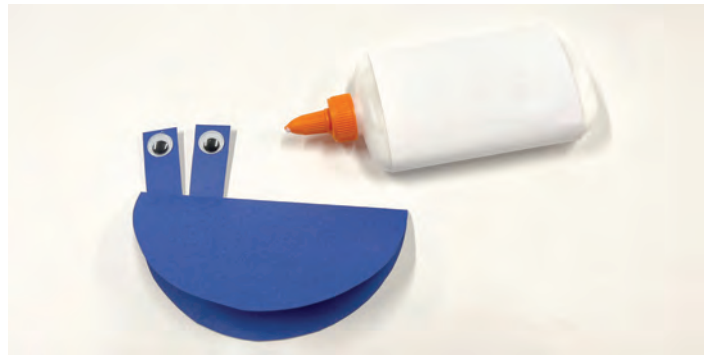
3. Fold the circle in half.



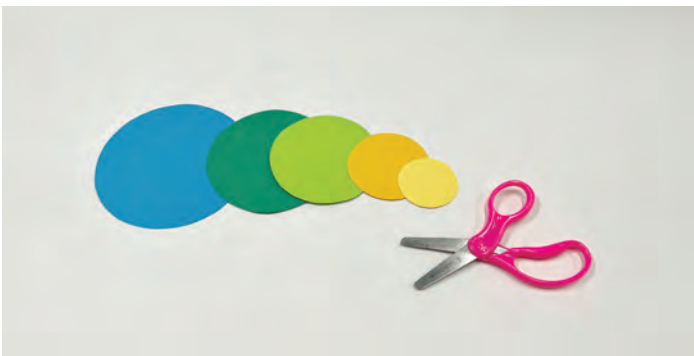
4. Cut out two 2 x 0.75 inch rectangle out of blue construction paper.



5. Glue the rectangles to the back of the folded edge of the blue circle to create the snail's body.



6. Glue googly eyes to the blue rectangles.



7. Cut out smaller circles using 5 different colors of construction paper.



8. Take the smaller circles and glue them together.



9. Glue the circles to the construction paper snail's body.



10. Use a marker to draw a mouth.



11. You have finished your craft! Try to rock the snail back and forth.

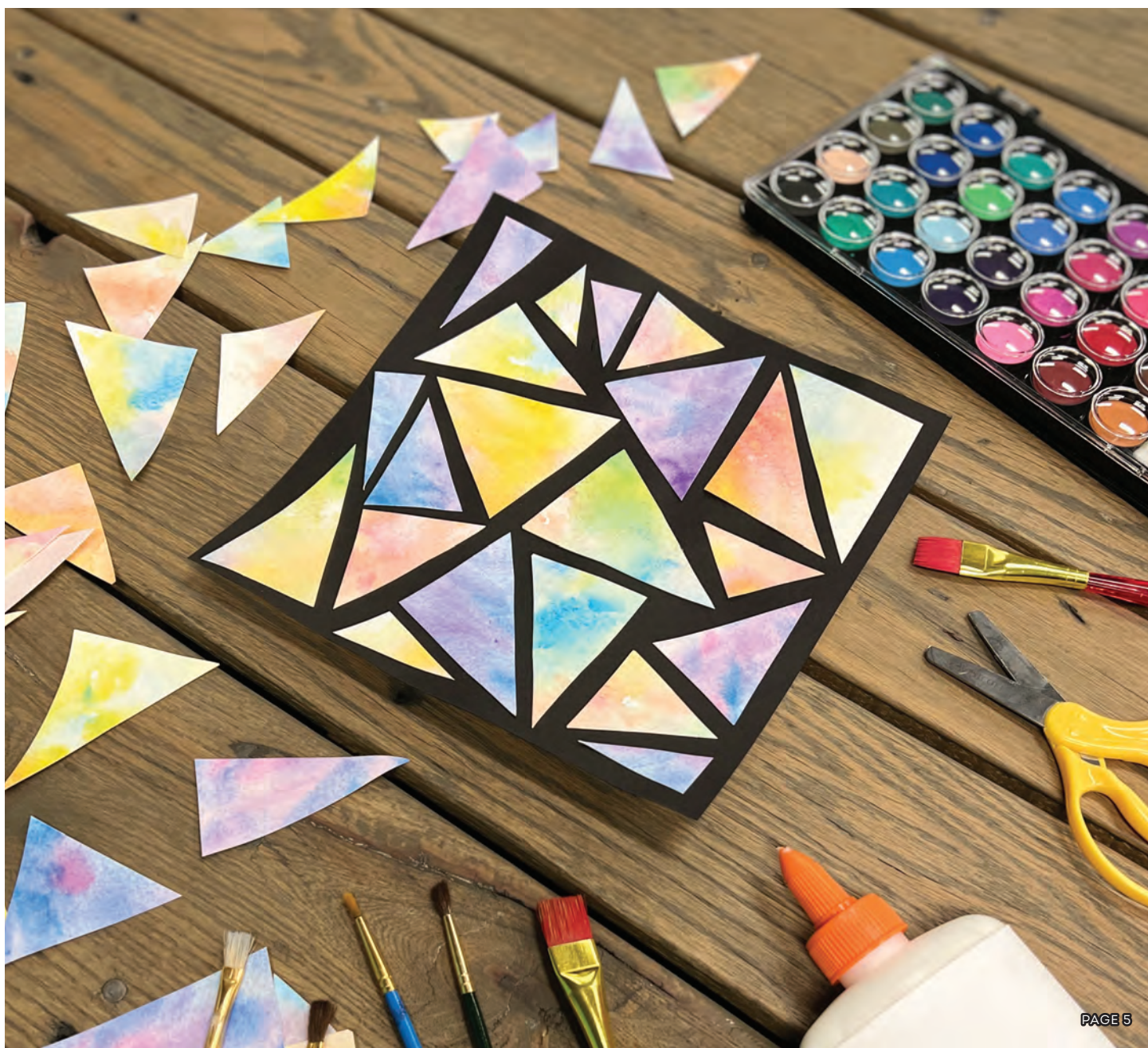
WATERCOLOR PAINTING CRAFT

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Safety scissors
- Watercolor paper
- Non-toxic glue
- Non-toxic watercolors
- Paint brush
- Construction paper
- Ruler



CAUTION: The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling. Adult use of safety scissors recommended for children 3 years or younger.





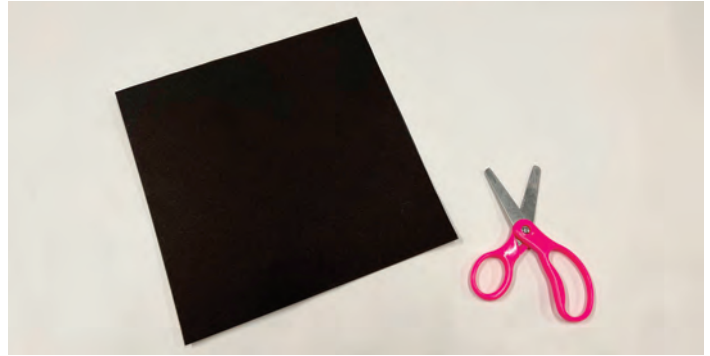
1. Before you begin prepare watercolors, watercolor paper, and a paint brush.



2. Create 3 different watercolor paintings. Let them dry completely.



3. Cut the paintings into triangular shapes.



4. Cut out a 9 x 9 inch square from black construction paper.



5. Lay out the triangles onto the square before gluing them. You can make the triangles fit by cutting them smaller.



6. Glue the triangles to the black construction paper.

TISSUE PAPER STAINED GLASS CARD

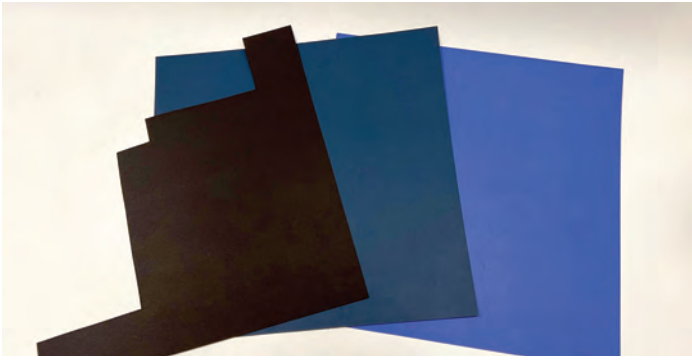
WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Safety scissors
- Non-toxic glue
- Paint brushes
- Non-toxic craft glue
- Pencil
- Construction paper
- Copier paper
- Tissue paper (various colors)
- Ruler



CAUTION: The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling. Adult use of safety scissors recommended for children 3 years or younger.





1. Start with a dark color of construction paper.



2. Cut out a 12 x 8 inch rectangle and fold it in half to create a card.



3. Sketch the cutout areas on the front cover.



4. Cut out the shapes you have sketched.



5. Cut out a rectangle using copier paper that fits into the inside of the card.



6. Glue the copier paper rectangle into the inside of the card.



7. Cut different colored tissue paper into small rectangular shapes.



8. Use craft glue to attach the tissue paper to the inside of the card. Make sure to let the craft glue dry completely.



9. Close the card to see the stained glass effect!
