


# **ACTIVITIES FOR HOME**



CRAFT SAFETY: Adult supervision is required for any arts & crafts project. Observe children closely and intervene as needed to prevent potential safety problems and ensure appropriate use of materials. Some craft items are potential choking hazards for young children. Avoid use of small parts with children ages 3 or younger. Read all manufacturers' warnings before using arts & crafts supplies.





## **POP-UP SUNCATCHER**

### WHAT YOU'LL NEED:


- Cardboard
- · Non-toxic marker
- Paint brush

- Tissue paper
- · Safety scissors
- Pencil

- Non-toxic craft glue Vellum paper



CAUTION: The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling. Adult use of safety scissors recommended for children 3 years or younger.





1. Place a piece of cardboard on a flat surface.



2. Use a pencil to sketch a turtle with a window for the stained glass effect.



3. Cut out the turtle you sketched out.



4. Get a piece of vellum paper, tissue papers that are cut into small pieces, and cardboard to use as a protective mat.



5. Use craft glue to attach the pieces of tissue paper to the vellum paper to create the stained glass effect. Let it dry.



6. Cut the dried stained glass vellum paper in the shape of the turtle shell, and glue it to the back of the cardboard shape.




7. Use a marker to draw on details.



8. Cut out small stands out of cardboard.








10. When it is dried, stand up your craft.





### **POP-UP LADYBUGS**

### WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Construction paper Googly eyes
- Non-toxic markers
- · Non-toxic craft glue
- Safety scissors
- Pencil




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




1. Pick out construction paper colors.



3. Cut out the circles.




5. Cut a slit into the circles that goes to the center of the circle.



7. Take the medium-sized circle and glue it to the ladybug's body.



2. Use a pencil to sketch out 2 large circles, 1 medium circle, and 12 small circles.



4. Fold the 2 large-sized circles in half.



6. Slot the 2 circles together to create the pop-up effect.



8. Take the 12 small circles and glue them to each flap of the ladybug's body.



9. Cut 2 small strips of construction paper.



10. Curl up one side of each construction paper strip.




11. Glue the 2 small strips to the head of the ladybug.



12. Glue 2 googly eyes to the head of the ladybug.





### POP-UP ANIMAL CARD

### WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Safety scissors
- · Non-toxic craft glue
- · Construction paper · Pencil
- Non-toxic markers



CAUTION: The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling. Adult use of safety scissors recommended for children 3 years or younger.






Pick out construction paper colors.




Cut a 2- x 7-inch rectangle out of orange construction paper. Then section the rectangle into 1/2-,2-,2-,2-, and  $^{1}\!/_{2}$  inch parts. Fold the rectangle at each section.




5. Cut out the leg holes.



7. Cut out the head.



2. Cut a 5- x 12-inch rectangle out of blue construction paper, and fold it in half to create the card backdrop.



Use a pencil to sketch out the leg holes on each side.



6. Use a pencil to sketch out the head of a cat on a piece of construction paper.



8. Use a pencil to sketch out a tail and cut it out.



9. Glue the back of the body to the card backdrop, and glue only the feet to the bottom of the card.



10. Glue the tail to the card backdrop.



11. Use markers to draw facial details on the head.



12. Glue the head onto the front of the body.
